

How long do I have to register?

Registration remains open until one week before the start of the camp week you'd like your child to attend. We recommend registering early to secure your spot, as weeks can fill up quickly!

What ages can attend Camp CHOF?

Camp CHOF offers programs for boys and girls ages 5-18. The ONLY exceptions made to attend a week not specified for their age group are those with a diagnosed disability. If this is the case, please contact the camp office directly.

Drop-off & Pick-up

DAY CAMP

- Day campers be dropped off at the Camp CHOF Lodge (8:30am) or brought to Canton Baptist Temple (Door D, 8am) to ride the bus out to the camp.
- On Monday, please arrive early to complete the check-in process.
- We are on a tight schedule, so please be prompt! If you are running late, please call the church office at (330) 477-6267 as soon as possible to let us know.
- Day campers can be picked up at 4pm at the Camp CHOF Lodge, or at CBT at 4:30pm (Door D). **YOU MUST SHOW A VALID ID IN ORDER TO SIGN OUT A CAMPER.**

OVERNIGHT CAMP

- Check-in begins at 6pm on Sunday in the Tabernacle. You will walk with your camper through all check-in stations, and then a staff member will escort you to your camper's cabin, where you will be able to help them get their bunk set up for the week if needed.
- Check-out begins immediately following the closing ceremony at 7pm on Friday in the Tabernacle. Our brief closing ceremony will include the recap video for the week, hearing a brief statement from the speaker for that week, and finding out which team won the week. Once dismissed, campers will go back to their cabins, and guardians will join one of the three check-out lines based on last name. **CAMPERS ARE NOT PERMITTED TO LEAVE WITHOUT BEING SIGNED OUT.** You must show your valid ID, and you must be listed as an authorized pick-up in order to sign out a camper.

Campers are grouped by age, so each program is tailored to their developmental level and interests.

What kind of activities do campers get to do?

Campers enjoy a wide variety of activities, including:

- Rock wall climbing, zip-line, high-ropes course, giant swing (resident camp only)

- Go-karts (Resident camp), pedal carts/crazy carts (day camp)
- Swimming
- Jump pad
- Canoeing (Teen Week only)
- Archery
- Gellyball (resident camp only)
- Crafts & Game room

Is Camp CHOF a Christian camp?

Yes! Camp CHOF is a **Christ-centered camp** where kids grow in their faith through daily chapel services, cabin devotions, and Christian role models. We focus on teaching biblical truth in a way that's engaging, encouraging, and age-appropriate. We have daily chapel messages and evening services by guest speakers for our resident campers. Day campers received Christ-centered lessons daily that incorporate the theme while learning about Jesus.

How is safety handled at camp?

Safety is our top priority. All staff are background-checked and trained in child safety and emergency procedures. Lifeguards are certified, and medical staff are always on-site.

Do you accept campers with disabilities or special needs?

Yes! Camp CHOF is committed to making camp a welcoming experience for all children to the best of our abilities. If your child has a disability, medical condition, or special need, please contact our Camp Director or Secretary in advance so we can understand how to best support them during their week. Please understand that we will try our very best to accommodate all special needs, but each case will need to be evaluated to ensure we are fully equipped for the needs of your camper.

What are the sleeping and bathroom arrangements like?

Campers stay in clean, comfortable cabins with campers of the same gender and similar age. Each cabin has adult supervision. Restrooms and showers are located in the bathhouse nearby. The bathhouse is not co-ed and is under adult supervision.

What kind of supervision is provided?

Each cabin has trained counselors who stay with the campers day and night. Our low staff-to-camper ratio ensures every child is known, cared for, and guided throughout the week. Day Camp counselors stay with the children in their group of 4-8 campers at all times.

What if my child doesn't know anyone else at Camp CHOF?

That's okay, many campers come without knowing anyone! Our staff are trained to create a welcoming environment and help kids build friendships quickly through team games, cabin bonding, and shared experiences. If your camper is attending with a friend and would like to be placed in the same cabin or group, please specify so in the friend request portion of the registration process. Both campers must request each other be guaranteed placement together

Are any discounts available?

Each week of camp is affordably priced, and we offer:

- **American Hero Scholarships (military and first responders)** application can be found through their Ultracamp portal, or email offices@campchof.org to apply. This scholarship grants one free week of camp per child per family. Must have served actively within the past 10 years to be eligible.
- **Financial Assistance** applications can be found at the Canton Baptist reception desk during the week, or email offices@campchof.org to apply. Cannot be combined with any other discounts.
- **Early Bird Discount** can be applied if registration is completed February 1-March 31. \$15 off one week for day campers and \$25 off one week for resident campers.
- **CBT Member Discount** for members of Canton Baptist Temple. \$10 off.
- **Multi-week Discount** can be applied for any additional weeks of camp within the same summer. Receive \$50 off each second or more week of day camp, and \$85 off each additional week of resident camp.

Can Camp CHOF accommodate allergies or medical needs?

Yes! We work with families to accommodate food allergies, medical needs, and other special concerns. Medications are collected at check-in and administered by our trained health team. Email offices@campchof.org to communicate specific needs.

Can I contact my child during the week?

We encourage kids to unplug and enjoy the full camp experience. However, parents are welcome to send letters or pre-written notes. We also offer a \$5 email package where you can send your camper an email a day, which will be printed out and put in their cabin mailbox. In the event of an emergency, we will contact you immediately.
